Thanks to everyone who helped make this day happen, particularly our parent volunteers, Sam Edwards, Robert Miloseski and Haylee Shaw.






















SPARE PARTS PUPPET THEATRE

"The Spare Parts Puppet Theatre was awesome. We started by listening and watching the "Hachiko Puppet Show". The whole show was about 1 and a half hours.




BOOK FAIR 2022
