INTRODUCING OUR NEW STEAM BUILDING





Hi everyone and welcome back to a new school year. This year has seen the opening of the new STEAM room. STEAM covers the areas of Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics. At Hopetoun Primary, the P-6 classes access the STEAM room for Science and Art this year.

All classes have been having fun in Science already with this term focus being Chemical Science. Each class comes to Science for two one blocks where we have been investigating states of matter before ending each session with experimenting how different matter reacts to the application of elements such as heat and force. An additional focus has been on exploring the concept of Non-Newtonian fluids such as slime.

In Art this term we are focusing on dance, we are challenging ourselves to learn a new dance as well as choreographing our own dances in small groups.

I am enjoying the enthusiasm that all students are displaying in both Science and Dance already and thank our school community for their support and encouragement in my new teaching role this year.

Dear parent/carer

Further to my previous COVID-19 communications, you may have seen the announcement of the high caseload settings in place across WA as of Tuesday 8 February 2022. This includes additionalmeasures to keep our schools open and providing face-to-face learning to your children.

In the current settings, parents and carers can no longer enter classrooms, including to volunteer. Volunteering in the canteen or at the uniform shop is still permitted, while following the WA Government mask wearing mandates, and physical distancing from other adults.

You are allowed on school grounds for drop-off and pick-up in outdoor locations, but please physically distance, avoid gathering where possible and follow mask wearing requirements if youhave travelled from a mask-mandated region within the last 2 weeks.

We are currently planning and implementing further ways to minimise the risk of COVID-19 enteringor being transmitted at schools including:

- moving parent-teacher interviews to online or over the phone;
- changing indoor face-to-face events;
- cancelling or postponing school camps;
- limiting the mingling of groups; and
- modifying timetables, break times, and pick-up and drop-off times, where practical.

We are working through these changes and you will receive further communications as the details are confirmed. For more information on the high caseload protocols visit <u>WA.gov.au</u>.
